English-taught degree programmes in Germany

for cooperation in teaching (e.g. student exchange with credit transfer)

Both Indonesian and German universities often have an interest in student exchange with credit transfer, e. g. for one or two semesters. Student mobility could be planned in both directions, German students to the Indonesian partner universities and Indonesian students to the German partner university. As a presupposition to such an exchange semester with credit transfer the participating universities need to have matching / complementary degree programs fully taught in English.

Germany offers more than 2.000 degree programs entirely taught in English, about 365 BA programmes and 1.770 MA programmes. In most subjects, is it largely possible to do a PhD in English in Germany.

by choosing English as the course language (in 'more filters').

At 'Course of studies' you can narrow the search down to e.g. engineering programs and further to different subfields of engineering.

If you click on a course you get more information on duration, admission, beginning, tuition fees etc.

As you might know, the German Higher Education system is largely dominated by public universities which do not charge tuition fees (with the exception of one out of 16 federal states). However, we also have private universities who do charge tuition fees.

We would recommend you to look for potential partner universities by checking the study programs and the universities. There are links of course also links to the study program itself provided.

German universities are generally interested in student exchange with credit transfer and, if the experience is good, double degree programs. We would like to encourage you to pro-actively contact a German university that offers programs taught in English that look complementary to your programs and invite them to an online discussion on the matter. The right point of contact in the German university is the International Office and the faculty that runs the study program, e.g. the organizer or speaker of the study program. We would actually recommend to contact both.
